OVERVIEW

The Competitiveness School: for Leading Regions, Clusters and Cities is designed to enable senior policymakers. managers and development professionals to study and discuss global best practices in competitiveness and economic development using examples from all over the world, including Denmark, Austria, Brazil and Tanzania and cities such as New York, Singapore or Vancouver.

This Competitiveness School is jointly organized by IESE Business School and the European Foundation for Cluster Excellence and is taught by the faculty of both institutions. The program is broken down into two one week modules. Participants may apply to attend one or both of modules.

This Competitiveness School is designed to be an enriching experience in which diverse individuals from different countries and different areas of practice have the opportunity to come together and learn from the faculty members and each other and discuss about the best practices to implement in their organizations.





CONTENT

Competitiveness is the core concept of our course, and we propose a multi-dimensional and comprehensive approach that will help participants to understand, raise and sustain competitiveness at all levels.

First, we look at competitiveness from two different but complementary perspectives:

Policy

how policies can help in securing economic and social development

Management

which strategic methodologies and frameworks can be use in competitiveness development.

For that purpose, we have divided the course in two oneweek modules, the Policy for Competitiveness Module and the Management for Competitiveness Module.

In both modules we deal with competitiveness at different levels: national/regional, cluster and city level.



Module 1

January 24-27, 2017

In the Policy for Competitiveness Module,

participants will be exposed to cases that will help them understand:

- **a)** how policies at the regional level affect competitiveness (Ex: California wine industry or Basque country strategy);
- **b)** how clusters and cluster initiatives can be applied in economic development and competitiveness policies (Ex: Regional development in Yorkshire);
- c) how strategic thinking at the city level and interaction between cities and local and regional governments can help in shaping competitiveness (Ex. Barcelona, Vancouver or Charlotte).

Module 2

January 30-February 2, 2017

In the Management for Competitiveness Module, participants will understand how strategic tools to enhance competitiveness can be used:

- a) at the regional level (Ex. Clusterland Upper Austria and Ontario):
- **b)** at the cluster level (Ex. Montreal circus cluster);
- c) at the city level (Paris, NYC)
